# The Third Half Treto poluvreme

The Third Half tells the story of several people gathered around the most important thing in the world - football, during the most turbulent time in the world's history - WWII. It is inspired by the true events account of the players of FC Macedonia and their German-Jewish coach Rudolph Spitz who leads them towards the champion title of the Nazi football league. It is the compelling story of club's founder Dmitry, who has to choose between his love for his team and his loyalty to the New Order. It is the story of his best striker Kosta, a notorious smuggler who falls in love with a beautiful rich girl and Rebecca, a Jewish princess, who elopes with her football player to live in his locker-room (and thereby eludes the bitter destiny of her people). Neither a war movie nor a Holocaust movie, it is more of a soccer epic: a story of misfits, pariahs, losers and idealists, who, during a turbulent time realize their game is more than just a game - it becomes a battle between good and evil. One of the most controversial Polish films ever made. Aftermath is a harrowing mystery-thriller based on the real-life cover-up of a Jewish massacre at the hands of Catholic Poles, Franck and Jozek Kalina, are brothers from a small village in central Poland. Franek immigrated to the United States in the 80s, and cut all ties with his family. When Franek finally returns to his homeland he discovers that Jozek has been ostracized from the community, and constantly receives various threats. As Franek and Jozek struggle to rebuild their relationship, they are drawn into a gothic tale of intrigue. The two brothers eventually uncover a dark secret that forces them to confront the history of their family and their hometown. Based on true events from a dark moment in Poland's history, Aftermath is considered one of the most important films ever made in Poland. A vear after its initial release, this film from awardwinning director Władysław Pasikowski is still causing shockwaves and soul-searching throughout Poland.

## Lemale et ha'halal

Fill the Void tells the extraordinary story of an Orthodox Hassidic family from Tel Aviv. Eighteen-yearold Shira is the youngest daughter of the Mendelman family. She is about to be married off to a promising young man of the same age and background but on Purim, her 28-year-old sister, Esther, dies while giving birth to her first child, Mordechay. When Esther's mother finds out that her son-in-law may remarry and move to Belgium with her only grandchild, she proposes a match between Shira and the widower. Shira will have to choose between her heart's wish and her family duty. This complex and beautifully layered film brings to life the universal themes of loss and family loyalty while giving an intimate portrait of this closed society.

This is the remarkable, true story of Aristides de Sousa Mendes, the Portuguese Consul General stationed in Bordeaux, France, during World War II. His government had issued strict orders to all its diplomats to deny visas to Holocaust refugees seeking to escape Occupied Europe through Portugal. Sousa Mendes defied these orders and issued Portuguese visas to an estimated 30,000 people described by the Holocaust scholar Yehuda Bauer as "perhaps the largest rescue action by a single individual during the Holocaust."

# Hunting Elephants Latzud Pilim

## There Was Once...







Mrs. Gyöngyi Magò is a Catholic high school teacher in Kalocsa, Hungary. While looking for a subject for her dissertation she discovered a forgotten part of local history, the Jewish community that once thrived but is now non-existent in her city. Engaging her students in her research, she teaches tolerance and fights prejudice in her classroom. Her quest is set against a background of renewed racial tensions, growing intolerance and the recurrence of neo-Nazism in Hungary today. She has managed to persuade the city leadership to commemorate this extinct community on the 65th anniversary of the liquidation of the local ghetto and deportation of the Jews to Auschwitz and other camps. This film is a portrait of this remarkable woman. More than that, however, it clearly demonstrates what one person can do to change attitudes, to fight intolerance, to educate, to champion the truth and ultimately to triumph.

# Broadway Musicals: A Jewish Legacy

Broadway Musicals: A Jewish Legacy - narrated by **Joel Grey** – explores the unique role of Jewish composers and lyricists in the creation of the modern American musical. Featuring interviews and conversations with some of the greatest composers and writers of the Broadway stage, Broadway Musicals: A Jewish Legacy showcases the work of some of the most preeminent creators of musical theatre including Irving Berlin, Jerome Kern, George and Ira Gershwin, Richard Rodgers, Oscar Hammerstein II, Kurt Weill, Leonard Bernstein, Stephen Sondheim and many others. Though these remarkable songwriters were purveyors of what we think of today as the Broadway sound, the documentary demonstrates how there were echoes of Jewish strains in many of the works. From Yiddishkeit on the stages of the Lower East Side at the turn of the century to a wide range of shows including Porgy and Bess, West Side Story and Cabaret, the film explores how Jewish music and ethos enlightens many of America's favorite musicals. A virtual behind-the-scenes-of-Broadway, it is an engaging, humorous, and provocative film, mixing and mingling ethnic cultural history with entertaining perspectives on the origins and meaning of some of Broadway's most beloved songs, stories and shows.

## The Other Son

Joseph is a regular 18-year-old who writes folk songs and plays the guitar. He has never looked much like the other members of his family, but they have always been a tightknit clan. When he reports for his pre-induction interview prior to his army service, a blood test reveals that he is not his parents' son. Research quickly reveals that at the time of his birth during the Gulf War, Joseph was evacuated from the hospital along with another baby and they were mixed up. While the Palestinian Joseph went home to the Silvers' to live in a comfortable suburb of Tel Aviv. the other son. Yacine, went to an Arab couple in the West Bank. Compounded by a deep cultural divide, frightening and optimistic feelings come in to play in this gripping film.

## The Jewish Cardinal Le métis de Dieu

The Jewish Cardinal tells the amazing true story of Jean-Marie Lustiger, the son of Polish-Jewish immigrants, who maintained his cultural identity as a Jew even after converting to Catholicism at a young age, and later joining the priesthood. Quickly rising within the ranks of the Church, Lustiger was appointed Archbishop of Paris by Pope Jean Paul II and found a new platform to celebrate his dual identity as a Catholic Jew, earning him both friends and enemies from either group. When Carmelite nuns settle down to build a convent within the cursed walls of Auschwitz, Lustiger finds himself a mediator between the two communities - and may be forced at last to choose his side.

Run Boy Run tells the extraordinary true story of a Polish boy who seeks the kindness of others in his struggle to outlast the Nazi occupation and keep alive his Jewish faith. Escaping the Warsaw ghetto at the behest of his father, nine-year-old Srulik flees to the woods. Taken in by a kindhearted farmer's wife, he is given shelter and a new identity. Passing himself off as Jurek, a Christian war orphan, the boy travels the countryside from village to village, working as a farmhand under an ever-present threat of persecution. Some will help him survive and others will betray him. Just when it seems his childhood memories. and identity could be lost forever, Jurek's harrowing journey comes full circle. *Run Boy Run* is directed by Oscar-winner Pepe Danquart and based on the bestselling Holocaust novel by Israeli author Uri Orlev.

# Friends from France Les Interdits

Set in 1979 in the midst of the Cold War, young French cousins join an organized tour to Odessa, visiting monuments and museums by day, but slipping away into the underground world of refuseniks (Jews persecuted by the Soviet regime who want to leave the country) by night. While Carole is motivated by her political commitments and a taste for risk, Jérôme is motivated by his attraction to Carole. In a particular recreation of Brezhnev-era Odessa, they discover an underground world, cruel and absurd while they connect in a deep way with those resisting oppression whether through literary efforts or escapism.
