About the Centre for Surgical Innovation

Since it's unveiling in 2013, the Centre for Surgical Innovation has already performed more than 4,100 advanced surgical procedures and 24,600 imaging procedures. The Centre has saved lives and prevented numerous additional surgeries for many Manitoba patients.

The Centre contains two advanced operating rooms, one located on either side of an intraoperative MRI suite. The MRI can enter either room while a patient is undergoing surgery. One room is primarily designed

to support neurosurgery – examples include treatment of brain tumours, epilepsy, or spinal cord injury. The other room is primarily designed to support neuro interventional procedures – examples include treatment of strokes and aneurysms.

The MRI provides surgeons with real-time medical imaging of a patient while a surgery is in process, allowing surgical teams to be more efficient and extremely precise - for example letting the team know if more surgery is required on the spot rather than having to perform another procedure at a later date.
