HEAR OUR VOICES Sexual and Gender-Based VIOLENCE in the October 7th HAMAS TERROR ATTACK

Break the Silence!

On Wednesday, January 24th (7 p.m. CST) JCFS Winnipeg brings a live audience and live-streamed discussion on anti-feminist violence and misogyny in the Hamas Terror Attacks on Israel on October 7th. This event is the first of its kind in Canada.

Hear Our Voices features a moderated discussion between **Gail Asper**, distinguished lawyer and noted philanthropist, and **Ayelet Razin Bet Or**, noted women's rights expert and former Director for Israel's Authority for the Advancement and Status of Women in the Ministry of Social Equality. **Ayelet** was instrumental in the coordination of the Israeli Advocacy on this issue at the United Nations.

This event, held at the **Canadian Museum for Human Rights**, will explore the gender-based violence in the Hamas attacks. Utilizing compelling testimony and evidence, our guided conversation will examine how gender-based violence, including sexual assault, was utilized as a tool of terror. Our speakers will discuss the global silence on the atrocities experienced Israeli women in these attacks, and how this silence has impacted Jewish women (and men) worldwide. Finally, **Hear Our Voices** bears witness and ensures the victims stories are heard.

There is limited in-person seating available for this event. The event will also be livestreamed nationally and internationally.

Gail Asper, O.C., O.M., LL.D., Chair, The Asper
Foundation

Gail Asper, a proud Winnipegger, obtained her B.A. and LL.B. from the University of Manitoba, Canada and practiced corporate and commercial law before becoming the President of The Asper Foundation in 2003.

Gail is currently the Chair of the Board and a Trustee of The Asper Foundation, a private Canadian charitable foundation which spearheaded the establishment of the Canadian Museum for Human Rights (CMHR). She served on the Board of the CMHR until 2023 and continues as an Honorary Board Member. She is also a Board Member of the Friends of CMHR where she led the \$150 million private sector National Capital Campaign for the Museum.

Gail currently is a member of the Board of Directors of the Shaarey Synagogue of Winnipeg and is a Member of the Executive of the Board of Governors of the Hebrew University of Jerusalem. She has served on the Boards and chaired campaigns of numerous not-for-profit groups such as the Royal Manitoba Theatre Centre, the United Way of Winnipeg, the National Arts Centre Foundation, the Combined Jewish Appeal Campaign of Winnipeg, the Jewish Federation of Winnipeg and Jewish Child and Family Service.

Gail has received numerous awards for her community service including the Jewish Federation of Winnipeg's Max and Mollie Shore Memorial Award, The Nellie McClung Foundation's Manitoba 150 Women Trailblazer Award, the Canadian Bar Association's President's Award and the Israel Bonds Israel 66 Award.

She has received four Honorary Doctorates including from the University of Manitoba and The Hebrew University of Jerusalem and was awarded the Queen's Golden and Diamond Jubilee Medal. She also has received the Order of Manitoba and has been inducted as an Officer of the Order of Canada.

She is married to Dr. Michael Paterson and has two wonderful sons, Stephen and Jonathan and an adorable Golden Doodle, Darwin.



Our Guest Speaker: AYELET RAZIN BET OR

Ayelet Razin Bet Or holds a graduate degree in Law and Criminology from Hebrew University and specialized in criminal law at the Jerusalem District Attorney's Office. In 2004, she began volunteering at Israel's Association of Assistance Centers for Victims of Sexual Assault and at the Public Defender's Office.

This familiarity with the field of sexual vulnerability and its consequences led to long-term specialization in the field of combating sexual violence, gender-based violence, and women's rights. Upon finishing her work at the Prosecutor's Office, she was appointed the legal advisor of the Association of Assistance Centers for Victims of Sexual Assault. She led various public advocacy initiatives on the issue of violence against women, including the long-standing lobbying for the approval of Israel's Electronic Surveillance Law. In addition, Ayelet worked to establish public committees and initiated the writing of public reports on law enforcement and the rights of crime victims. In 2022, she was appointed to the position of CEO of Israel's Authority for the Advancement of the Status of Women in the Ministry of Social Equality. Her duties and responsibilities included: building an overall strategic plan to advance the status of women at the national level and working with the various government ministries and civil society organizations within the field; promoting legislation on gender equality; combating violence and discrimination against women; and promoting adequate representation for women in all areas of life and in decision-making centers.

Most recently, Ayelet was instrumental in coordinating the important milestone advocacy at the United Nations, which validated and paved the way for a global acknowledgement of the horrific gender-based sexual violence perpetrated during the October 7th, 2023 Hamas terror attacks on Israel.

ABOUT JCFS HISTORY OF JCFS

In the early years of the Winnipeg Jewish community, Jewish social services were delivered through an informal network of soup kitchens, free dispensaries, and landmanshaften. That network was eventually replaced by more formal institutions, including the Esther Robinson Jewish Orphanage and Children's Aid Society; the United Hebrew Relief of Winnipeg; the Kneseth Israel Sisterhood; and the National Council of Jewish Women Social Service Department. In 1942, these separate initiatives amalgamated into the United Hebrew Social Service Bureau, later renamed the Jewish Family Service Bureau of Winnipeg. In 1952, the Bureau merged with the Jewish Children's Home and Aid Society to create Jewish Child and Family Service (JCFS).

Since then, JCFS has been the primary provider of social services to the Winnipeg Jewish community, offering an array of counselling, education and support programs to help clients cope with a diverse range of challenges and situations. JCFS currently offers family and individual counselling, older adult supports, child welfare services, foster care and adoption services, immigration and resettlement services, and mental health and addictions support. As a centralized multi-service agency, JCFS is constantly responding to community needs and expanding its services and programs whenever necessary.



JCFS is located on Treaty 1 territory, the ancestral lands of the Anishinaabe, Cree, Oji-Cree, Dakota, Dene People, and the homeland of the Métis Peoples.

We support calls by Indigenous peoples and Canadians alike for the implementation of Truth and Reconciliation Commission's Calls to Action.

It is bittersweet to a bring greeting from JCFS to our event, Hear Our Voices: Sexual and Gender-Based Violence in the October 7th Hamas Terror Attack. I am grateful that we live in a country where this topic of violence against women can be openly addressed, and yet saddened that we are in a position to have to address it.

JCFS is proud to welcome Ayelet Razin Bet Or and Gail Asper to help shed light on the realities of the Oct 7th attacks, their implications, and where we go from here.
